Its leather seat is moulded after the silhouette of full-blown sails, known as *buồm*, in Vietnamese traditional boat, and through expert craftsmanship, appears as if it's only touching the slanted legs. The solid oak frame enhances its sturdy support, with cross stretchers forming a visual dynamic with the seat's undulating lines. BUOM is the timeless companion that embodies our demands for lightness and refinement.




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
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
